FORMS

You should have received a variety of paperwork and forms. We ask that you read the information



carefully, return what is required, and pay for the school charges approved by the District using <u>CashOnline</u>. Directions for families new to <u>CashOnline</u> were sent home to parents who did not have an account.

BASIC SCHOOL SUPPLIES

For families new to our school and District, the Richmond School District provides basic school supplies to all students for a standard charge (\$33). This means that parents do not have to go shopping to find the materials their children need for school and that all children have access to the same materials. Some grades will also have an Agenda charge and others a Craft and Cooking Charge. If your family has financial challenges, please contact Mrs. Stapleton.



STUDENT ILLNESS



We are moving into our typical cold and flu season, and we can expect that there will be some illness in our community. We noticed over the last few years that with all the additional handwashing and staying home when unwell, the incidence of illness was lower, and we aim to keep it up again this year. Please ensure that your contact numbers are up to date with the office and that we can reach you to come pick up your child if necessary. It is a good idea to have a back-up-plan in case your child is ill! Please monitor your child for symptoms of illness daily. If your child does not feel well, please do not send them to school, as we will need to call you to come back and get them and we risk other students and staff becoming ill.

OUTSIDE PLAY EVERY DAY

Our students go outside to play every day at recess and lunch, even if it's raining. Please ensure that your child arrives with everything needed...boots, jacket with a hood or waterproof poncho (dollar store!) that can go over clothing, umbrella, inside shoes, full change of clothing. These items can be left at school so that you don't need to worry about them daily. Going outside in the rain isn't a problem with the right clothing!
