RETURN TO SCHOOL

It has been a smooth first week back to school this week for students returning on a part-time basis! Social distancing, hand washing and other safety measures have been the focus for the week so that everyone knows what is expected of them at school. Thank you to the staff at school for helping to get the school ready, the staff at home for helping their colleagues with workload, and to parents for helping your children understand the safety expectations. Great teamwork, everyone!

Don't forget that the children go outside RAIN or SHINE, so please make sure that they have proper clothing for both rainy weather and sunshine. Students are outside for 52 minutes at lunch time, so it is a long time if they don't have the appropriate clothing.

Thank you for remembering to send your children to school with a lunch and a water bottle! We are not able to give cutlery to students, so also include a spoon and/or fork in your child's lunch if necessary.

WORK COMPLETION

Teachers have put a great deal of time into preparing learning plans for the students. We understand that families have differing abilities to complete work, so we have asked teachers to indicate "must do" assignments. All students are expected to complete and submit the must do work. The rest of the work on the plan may be completed as time at home permits. Students are being assessed and will be given a report card or summary of learning at the end of the year, and the must do work is an important part of that. The School District has also indicated that students who are not completing and submitting their work cannot stay registered at the school, so it is important that this work is finished. Please contact your child's teacher if you need support with submitting assignments.

LIBRARY

All Spul'ukwuks families can return library books to the plastic bin outside of the school's front entrance. The bin will be out front between 8 am and 4 pm. There will be no late fines or charges for books that were taken out before our Spring Break. Thanks so much for helping to return our library collection.

NOTICE OF LATE RETURN

Every year, the District requires that students be in attendance in September. If a student is not able to attend before 12:00pm on Wednesday, September 9th, a Notice of Late Return must be completed and returned to the office by July 23rd. Please note that students who complete the form MUST be in attendance before the end of the school day on Wednesday, September 16th. If students do not return to school on September 16th, they may not be able to remain at Spul'u'kwuks on their return.
