Monthly REDI Greetings – April 2026

As part of our ongoing commitment to recognizing the diverse faiths, cultures, and histories that shape our school district, we offer these greetings to acknowledge important observances taking place in April.

April 1-9, 2026 – Pesach / Passover (Jewish)

Greeting: Chag Pesach Sameach to the Jewish students, staff, and families as you observe Pesach. May this time bring reflection, connection, and peace to your homes and communities.

Translation note: Pesach (פסח) is pronounced PEH-sakh (with a soft “kh” sound).

Context note: This meaningful festival honours themes of freedom, remembrance, and resilience and is often marked by family gatherings, storytelling, and traditional meals.

April 3, 2026 – Good Friday (Christian)

Greeting: To the Christian students, staff, and families, we send our warm regards as you observe Good Friday.

Context note: Good Friday is part of Holy Week in the Christian calendar and invites reflection on themes of sacrifice, compassion, and faith. This solemn day of reflection and remembrance commemorates the crucifixion of Jesus and is marked through prayer, worship services, and quiet observance.

April 5-6, 2026 – Easter Sunday and Easter Monday (Christian origin)

Greeting: Happy Easter to all who celebrate! May this time of renewal and hope bring joy, peace, and connection to your families and communities.

Context note: Easter Sunday celebrates the resurrection of Jesus and is one of the most significant observances in the Christian tradition. In many cultures and countries, Easter Monday continues the celebration with gatherings, community events, and time with family.

April 14, 2026 – Vaisakhi (Sikh)

Greeting: Warm greetings to the Sikh students, staff, and families celebrating Vaisakhi. May this day bring joy, reflection, and community spirit.

Translation note: Vaisakhi (ਵੈਸਾਖੀ) is pronounced Veh-SAH-khee.

Context note: This important day commemorates the founding of the Khalsa by Guru Gobind Singh Ji in 1699 and is also celebrated as a spring harvest festival. Vaisakhi is often celebrated with prayers, community gatherings, and acts of service.
