REMEMBRANCE DAY



Our Remembrance Day ceremony will be held next Wednesday, November 10th at 9:55. We have decided to pre-record the ceremony to avoid the technical issues that often accompany live broadcasts. Next Tuesday, we will email a program along with a link that will allow you to access the event on Nov. 10th. The link will be live for that day only. At school, we are going to have all our classes begin watching the recording at the same time. You

may either watch along with us, or with your family later in the day.

Did you know that Nov. 8th is National Aboriginal Veterans Day and that thousands of Aboriginal Canadians have served for Canada for over 200 years? From the Veterans Affairs Canada website, "The story of Indigenous service in the First and Second World Wars, the Korean War and later Canadian Armed Forces efforts is a proud one. While exact numbers are elusive, it has been estimated that as many as 12,000 First Nations, Métis and Inuit people served in the great conflicts of the 20th century, with at least 500 of them sadly losing their lives". KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

As mentioned in previous newsletters, Kindergarten registration for the 2022-2023 school year is now open. If your child already attending Spul'u'kwuks has a younger sibling (born in 2017) starting school next September, we encourage you to register <u>as soon as possible</u> within the Priority 1 period to

ensure that we have space for your child. Please refer to our website for important deadlines related to registration, transfers, District Programs, etc.

As per district policy, a student will normally attend their catchment school based on where their parents or legal guardians reside unless



there is no physical, resource or program space available. This provision may need to be applied more frequently, potentially resulting in more students needing placement outside their catchment school.

COMMUNICATING STUDENT LEARNING (REPORT CARDS)

As you are aware, there are two ways that teachers may share information with you about your child's learning (portfolios or traditional report cards). This year, we have two divisions that will be using portfolios to communicate student learning (Div. 6 and 7). Parents of students in those divisions will access a Mid-Year Summary of learning on Friday, February 11th. You have been emailed a letter providing you with more information, and you are invited to a Parent Information Session on Nov. 9th (see below). The rest of the divisions will be providing traditional report cards on either Friday, November 26th or Monday, November 29th.

For all reports this year, parents will access the reports electronically on the date indicated by the classroom teacher using either the Portfolio or their MyEd login. We will not be sending home paper copies of report cards. Please keep a copy of your child's report for your records. If you cannot access your child's reports electronically, please contact the office.


