PLANTS FOR PEACE

Some of our Intermediate students approached their teacher and asked if they could do something to help the people of Ukraine, who are dealing with a humanitarian crisis as a result of the invasion of their country. At the same time, Primary students were busy making packets of sunflower seeds from last year's Spul'u'kwuks harvest and wondering how they could help. From that, the idea of "Plants for Peace" was born.

All students will bring home a decorated packet of sunflower seeds (the national flower of Ukraine). We hope that each student can return with a donation, which we will give to the Canadian Red Cross, where our donation will be doubled. If you are unable to donate, you are welcome to keep the seed packet to grow your own sunflowers.



There are three ways to donate:

- Cash at school
- <u>CashOnline</u>

• Directly to the Canadian Red Cross (if you need a tax receipt). Please let us know if you donate this way so we can keep track of our school's donations.

We are so proud of our students and their desire to help those in need! We can see that they are clearly developing in their Personal and Social Core Competency. HOW TO GROW

Easy to grow! In late May, choose a sunny site with well-draining soil and sow seeds about 6-12mm deep and 7.5 to 10cm apart. Seeds can be started 2-3 weeks early indoors using plantable peat pots at 21C. Harden off seedlings then transplant to a site in full sun. Keep plants evenly watered and fertilize twice during the season with a granular 15-5-5 or equivalent. (Planting information from OSC seeds)

MASK MANDATE
