REMINDER: KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION FOR 2023-2024 AND DISTRICT PROGRAMS OPTIONS



Richmond School District 38 is excited to

welcome kindergarten registration applications for children born in 2018, turning 5 in 2023. These children will begin kindergarten in September 2023. Online registration opens on November 1, 2022.

Families are encouraged to register any time during the Priority 1 registration period (November 1 – January 20) for the best chance at attending their catchment school. All registration applications received any time during the Priority 1 registration period will receive placement decisions by February 3, 2023.

Instead of in person information evenings this year, the district has posted short videos that provide new kindergarten parents with information about the registration process, English Language Learner (ELL) assessments, and District Program Options – Early French Immersion and Montessori (including deadlines for applications).
