## COMMUNITY FRIDGE

As mentioned in a previous newsletter, we have a community fridge that is intended to provide food security for all who need it. Now that we have experienced having the fridge, we are seeing some issues with its use, specifically that students are taking food when there is not a need.

We ask two things of parents and guardians. The first is to speak with your child to see if they have enough food at school. If they say they need more (i.e., some don't bring a snack) and if you are able, please send more.

The second is to please have a conversation with your child about the use of the fridge with the following in mind:

- Our choices affect the whole school
- There is only a certain amount of food each delivery. When it runs out, there is no more food until the next delivery.
- The food is SHARED
- We are all responsible for making sure those who need food get it
- There is not enough for everyone, because we know that not everyone NEEDS it. We do not use the fridge because we don't like our lunch or because we "feel like" having a snack.
- We don't take from the fridge just because it is "free"
