## **Student Lunches**

We encourage parents to send lunches to school with their children in the morning, as it avoids confusion at lunchtime.

If you must drop off your child's lunch later in the morning, please make sure that the lunch is here <u>before 11:50am</u> (see note below about Div. 15-17). Primary classes often begin eating early, and students need to have their lunches here when the class is ready to eat. <u>Drop off of student lunches for</u> <u>Divisions 1-14 will be directly to the classroom outside door</u>. Each room has a ledge where you can leave the lunch. <u>Drop</u> <u>off for Divisions 15, 16, and 17 will be on the black cart inside</u> <u>the front doors of the school</u>. The teachers of these three classes request that student lunches be delivered by 11:20am.

**Libby's Kitchen** is available to resume delivery of student lunches Monday to Friday, except on PAC Hot Lunch days. Ordering can only be done <u>online</u>, and the website is open to accept orders. The first delivery day is Monday, September 9th. Ordering instructions are attached to this newsletter. If you used Libby's Kitchen last year, please make sure to go in and update your child's division so that their lunch is delivered to the right place! **PAC Hot Lunch** will be every Monday, beginning in October. More information will be available soon.

# **Personal Digital Devices**

You may have heard that the Ministry of Education has introduced a new policy limiting the use of personal digital devices in schools.

Any personal electronic device that can be used to communicate or to access the internet, such as a cell phone, a tablet, smart watch, gaming device, and electronic toy is not permitted during the school day (from the beginning to the end of day), nor during break times.

In elementary school, it is recommended that students do not bring personal digital devices to school. If a student brings a device, it must be powered off and stored in their backpack or a secure location.

The district values the collaborative partnership among students, parents and staff. To maintain a focused learning environment, parents/caregivers are kindly asked not to contact their child on their personal digital devices during the school day. In cases of an emergency, parent(s)/caregiver(s) should contact the school office where staff will facilitate the communication as appropriate.
