#### **New Families...**

If this is your first time having a child enrolled in Richmond, you should have received an email from the District asking you to opt-in to School Messenger. This is a way that you can be sent important notifications or emergency information. We hope that all parents will opt-in. If parents opted in last year, you do not have to do it again.

#### City of Richmond

### **Drop-off Traffic**

We were lucky the first couple of weeks when drop-off traffic seemed light! Add another week and some rain, and we are beginning to see the congestion that happens on Westminster Highway, Blanshard Drive, and in our drop-off lanes.

Please remember that schools were not built to handle great numbers of students being driven to school and if you choose to drive, expect to wait in traffic. We will do our best to keep traffic moving along in the drop-off lane and need drivers to do their part.

If you wish to take your child to their classroom or to speak with your child's classroom teacher, do not use the drop-off lane. It is for immediate unloading only. Please do not get our of your car.

A better choice is to walk to school, either all the way, or part-way. You have a chance for your child to be settled and ready for the day and you can avoid the frustration of waiting in traffic.

At Spul'u'kwuks, we have committed to learning the truth about the past and to taking steps toward reconciliation (our mural is one example). Leading up to our assembly on Friday, September 27th, classes have been talking about what makes a good school, which is something residential school students did not have. On the day of our assembly, classes will also take a reconciliation walk and take time to think about provocations they find along the way.
