Ministry Childcare Centre Update

We have received word that we are entering the next phase of this project. You can expect to see digging for the connection of utilities between the main building and the daycare site, and all the required works taking place around the site. After this phase is complete, around mid-February, the installation of the modular will take place.

The modular daycare consists of three smaller modular units that will be shipped and unloaded on site by huge cranes, then put together.
